

Department of Sociology organized an online seminar entitled Basic Strategies of Research Methodology in Social Sciences on 25/06/2021.




Interactive Session on Gender and Sexuality


World Environment Day


World Zoonoses Day

Wetland Biomonitoring as part of Dragon fly Festival

WWF India has launched the Dragonfly Festival to raise awareness about Odonates (dragonflies and damselflies) in all walks of life. This is in partnership with BNHS, UNEP, ZSI, Dragonfly South Asia Society, Indian Dragonfly Society, Society for Odonate Studies, MIT-WPU University and India Biodiversity Portal. This year, in addition to the ongoing events, Wetland Biomonitoring is also organized as part of this festival. Odonates are an integral part of wetland ecosystems and they are considered as an indicator species of wetland health. Hence, regular monitoring of these lesser-known species, which can only complete its lifecycle and survive in this crucial ecosystem, has become significant.

Department of Zoology joined hands with WWF- India Kerala Chapter for wetland Biomonitoring programme. We were deputed to conduct odonate survey along Vellayani - Lake side road transects on 31st October 2021. 12 students from our department were guided by Mr. Jayakrishnan, WWF Volunteer. 12species of dragon flies and 4 species of damselflies were identified from the transect. Among them, Brachythemis contaminata dominated which indicates poor water quality of the Lake.



Recent Trends in Climate Mitigation and Pollution Control

As part of ARC 2022, an international conference on Recent Trends in Climate Mitigation and Pollution Research was organized on 10 - 11th March 2022 (Online mode) by the Department of Zoology. Key Note Address was delivered by Dr. Harinarayanan P, Principal Scientist, KSCSTE on the topic "Climate Change Hazards and Mitigation". First technical session was done by Dr. Kurian Mathew Abraham, Assistant Professor, Department of Aquatic Biology & Fisheries, University of Kerala on the topic "Eco-informatics tools for Biologists". The second day began with the session handled by Dr. Nalini K. Post doctoral Researcher, Geocarb Mission, University of Oklahoma, US. on the Topic "Adapting to Climate Change and Climate Resilience". The third session was done by Dr. Thampan Meloth, Scientist G, Group Director, Polar Sciences, National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research, Ministry of Earth Sciences, Government of India on the topic "Antarctica - The Land and Life on Edge". This was followed by paper presentations.

Bottle Art organized by Department of Botany


Department of Botany organized a skill development programme on Bottle Art on 11/11/2021 that was participated by nearly fifty students.


Reusing of Plastic for Homem Décor

This programme was organized by the department of Botany and it imparted skills to students in transforming plastic waste to home decor materials.




CHYMICUS 2021


Observance of Ozone Day






Career Guidance Programmes
