## A Report on Activities of Walk With Scholar Program in Mahatma Gandhi College During the Academic Year 2016-17.

#### **About WWS Program**

"Walk with Scholar" is a mentoring program functioning under the "New Initiatives in Higher Education" of the Department of Collegiate Education, Government of Kerala. This scheme introduces the idea of mentoring to under graduate students and builds on the concept of mentor as a 'Guide' and 'Friend'. Mentoring is a process where a mentor with greater experience and wisdom guides the mentee to develop both personally and professionally.

As the part of the program, WWS started in our college from 2014-15 academic year. At present, there are 90 mentees under this scheme and 15 teachers of the college are deputed as internal mentors of these mentees. Each mentor is assigned the charge of six mentees.

On the basis of a proposal submitted to Higher Education, Government of Kerala, Mahatma Gandhi College was selected for a motivational visit program for the second year WWS mentees to various Educational institutions in Bangalore. The motivational visit started on 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2017. A group of 25 second year mentees participated the in the program and 3 faculty members Dr. K. Radhakrishnan, the coordinator; Dr. N. Gopakumar, internal mentor and Dr. Resmi Reghunandan, internal mentor were accompanied the team. As the part of the visit, our team visited a prestigious educational institute, **Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore (IIMB) on 23-03-2017.** 



On the second day, we visited the prestigious institute **Indian Institute of Science** (**IISc**), Bangalore.



On the same day afternoon, we visited Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) Heritage and Aerospace Museum.



On the third day we visited Lalbagh and Viswesvarayya Industrial and Technological Museum



The trip gave the students an excellent opportunity to visit the prestigious institutions of India and as the name indicates it was really a motivational visit. Soon after the visit, the coordinator and the student participants of the program submitted the detailed report and expenditure statement to the WWS Office.

#### **State Motivation Camp – FOCUS 2017**

One of our second year mentees Miss. Kavya S Mony attended a three day residential camp, the State Motivation camp – Focus 2017, conducted at Maria Rani Training centre, Sreekaryam, Thiruvananthapuram during the period 17-02-2017 to 19-02-2017. Soon after the completion of the program, she sent the report on the camp to the WWS Office and at the same time, she shared her experiences at the camp to other mentees of the college.

## Motivation Program for I Year and III Year Students to CUSAT and Near by Places

As per the direction of office of new initiative, we have conducted a two day motivation visit to Ernakulam with a team of 30 students of I year and III year mentees, and that was to compensate the 25 hours of external mentoring. As part of the program, we visited School of Engineering and different departments of Cochin University of Science and Technology (CUSAT), the Centre for Science in Society, CUSAT (C-SiS), Kerala History Museum, Kochi etc. on 08-06-2017 and 09-06-2017. The Coordinator Dr. K. Radhakrishnan and the internal mentors Sri R. Manoj and Dr. N. Lekshmi Priya were accompanied the students.

The team attended external mentoring sessions at the School of Engineering, CUSAT and Applied Chemistry Department, CUSAT. Dr. M. R. Radhakrishna Paniker, the Principal, School of Engineering, CUSAT and Dr. Jacob Elias, Associate Professor, School of Engineering have conducted mentoring sessions on the Importance of Technology in Life. The students visited different laboratories at School of Engineering, CUSAT. Also they interacted with different faculty members, technical staff and students at this institution. Dr. K. Gireesh Kumar, Head and Professor, Applied Chemistry, CUSAT and his team have conducted mentoring sessions on the Scope of Science in Higher Studies. Here also, the students interacted with different faculty members, technical staff

and research fellows at this institution. Students have also visited different research laboratories at the Department of Applied Chemistry. The team also visited Photonics Department, CUSAT.



The mentors and mentees visited the Centre for Science in Society at CUSAT. The students have attended a class handled by Dr. K. G. Nair, the founder and present director of C-SiS at CUSAT. Another class was handled by Dr. Gopalakrishnan, Retd. Professor in Physics. Students also visited Science park, Herbal Park, Butterfly Garden, E-Science Exhibit, ISRO Pavilion, Science Pavilion, See and Believe Labs in the C-SiS.

The team also visited the Kerala History Museum, Edappally, Kochi. Students were motivated by the models in the Model Museum, the Art Gallary and self narrative history museum containing the history of Kerala state and important events and cultures in Kerala before freedom and after freedom period.



#### **Conduct of Mock Test and Interviews for Final Year Students**

Different sets of multiple choice questions have been collected from various teachers and experts from different areas like Numerical ability, Reasoning, General English, General knowledge, Current affairs etc. in order to make final year students competent to different competitive examinations. Examinations were conducted using these questions and evaluated the answer scripts. Answer keys were also supplied after the examinations. A mock interview was conducted for the final year students on 27-05-2017 by Sri. Jayan. K. A., DCMAT, Wagamon and a mock group discussion was done for the final year students on 03-06-2017 by Dr. Mathew K A, Bhawans College of Arts and Commerce.

#### **Internal Mentoring**

More than ten hours of internal mentoring were conducted for the mentees by the respective internal mentors. Internal mentoring were conducted periodically as per the convenience of internal mentors and mentees. Different mentors followed different methods for internal mentoring. As the part of internal mentoring, the mentors discussed family issues, academic issues, career options, personality problems, communication skill problems etc with their mentees. Some of the mentors visited various educational, research and industrial institutions with their mentees. Internal mentors periodically took feedback form the mentees and evaluated the progress on different issues of mentees.
