


# **DAY-2 (25 MARCH,2022)**

### **Commencement of Technical Session -6 Paper Presentations**



Day 2 of the program began with the 4th technical session. Dr Manju S Nair was the keynote speaker and she focused on the healthcare utilisation of people before and after Covid-19. She explained the core factors that affected the utilisation of healthcare and how Covid affected healthcare utilisation. Dr Krishna Kumar was the keynote speaker for the 5th

session where he provided the historical context of the economic crisis in Kerala. He emphasised that Covid-19 may not be the only underlying factor contributing to the economic crisis of Kerala by providing the historical context of the economic crisis of the state. The 6th session was the paper presentation chaired by Dr Priyesh CA. There were 12 presentations explaining their perspectives on various elements of the Kerala Economy. Dr Priyesh provided his valuable suggestions to the paper presenters concerning their presentations. The last session of the seminar was headed by Dr P.S Nair, he explained the demographic challenges that Kerala is about to face after the Covid-19 pandemic. He provided various examples from countries like China to elaborate his points.
